GRAPE VARIETY

Shiraz

COLOUR

Deep crimson with soft brick hues

NOSE

A bright and lifted bouquet with lovely floral notes, combined with hints of white pepper. Complexity develops further in the glass with dense blackberry and dried herbs.

PALATE

A very elegant and balanced wine. Delightful palate weight, more medium than full bodied, with layers of dark fruits and dark chocolate, with lovely herbal notes of dried bay leaf and a flinty mid palate. The tannins are firm, silky and polished with a long and even finish.

VINTAGE CONDITIONS

The 2017 vintage commenced about four weeks later than usual with mild temperatures throughout February. This allowed all vineyards to produce strong yields and high quality, and has delivered some absolute standout wines from pedigree vineyards. In particular, Shiraz has delivered an exciting array of styles from vibrant flavoursome wines through to rich and complex styles with great texture and cellaring potential.

WINEMAKING

The St Hallett winemaking philosophy is relatively simple - minimum intervention and maximum attention.
